



Thank you for considering a Registered Nurse Graduate Program at Kerang District Health.

KDH takes a minimum of 3 Registered Nursing graduates each year, with rotations through the Acute Ward, District Nursing, Theatre and Residential Care Facility. Graduate Nurses are employed 8 shifts per fortnight, with no night duty rostered during the year.

The program is supported by a Clinical Nurse Educator and an enthusiastic team of experienced RNs & ENs. There are supernumerary periods at the start of each rotation through a new area, and a program of clinical hurdles to achieve.

In-house education is provided over a minimum of 4 study days throughout the year, with a suite of on-line learning packages to complete too. Grads get the opportunity to become competent at cannula insertion and are introduced to triage and advanced life support in the second half of the year.

While Kerang District Health cannot guarantee permanent ongoing employment at the end of the program, the organisation has a high retention rate and often offers casual contracts that lead to permanent employment.

If you are not from Kerang, there is very reasonably priced accommodation available in newly renovated accommodation quarters (\$10-15 per night). The accommodation is clean, spacious and self-contained, with a study lab complete with computers and free WiFi.

Kerang District Health has salary packaging, a social club, free onsite parking and freshly cooked meals available for lunch and dinner at reasonable prices. There is an abundance of clean country air, and access to many lakes and rivers within a 25 km radius.
