Glenarm Nursing Home is situated on the same site as Kerang District Health and comprises of 30 single rooms with individual ensuite.

Qualified nursing staff provide individualised personal care 24 hours a day.

Glenarm Philosophy

Glenarm has a diverse role in the care of the frail aged from the surrounding community. As the population ages and persons can no longer cope in their own home, they can be assured of quality care in a safe homelike environment when they enter Glenarm.

They are encouraged to participate in their own care as much as possible and still maintain their community contact. Staff have the training to provide physical emotional and psychological care of consumers who have a multiplicity of medical needs.

A typical room consists of:

- adjustable bed
- wardrobe
- bed side drawers
- lounge chair
- ducted heating and cooling
- telephone and TV
- air conditioning
- lifting hoist

There are a number of adjoining rooms for couples, when available.

Pictures, photos and other personal items are welcome to enhance your personal space; articles of furniture will need to be approved with management for suitability and storage prior to placement.

Pricing

The Australian Government pays for the bulk of aged care services in Australia through subsidies paid to aged care providers.

All consumers of aged care services are asked to contribute to costs according to their financial position. If people cannot afford to pay for care and accommodation costs the Australian Government will assist the individual to meet the gap in their payment.

The fees which you may be asked to pay are:

The fees which you may be asked to pay from 1 April, 2026 are:

1. A Basic Daily Fee (BDF) – paid by all people who receive residential care. For some people, this is the only fee they may need to pay.

Contributions based on your means assessment: -

2. A Hottelling Supplement contribution (HSC) – This supplement covers daily living expenses such as cleaning, meals and laundry over and above the basic daily fee. Services Australia advises the contribution amount from an income and assets assessment.
3. Non-clinical care contribution (NCCC) – This covers the non-clinical services like social support and lifestyle activities. Payable depending on a resident's assessable assets and income. You may be eligible for Government financial assistance. This fee has a daily cap and lifetime cap.
4. An Accommodation Payment – a payment for accommodation in an aged care home. Some people will have their accommodation costs paid in full or in part by the Australian Government. Others will need to pay the accommodation price they negotiate with their aged care home.

Fees for extra or additional optional services – an extra payment resident can be asked to pay if a higher standard of accommodation is chosen or additional services are elected.

Glenarm Accommodation Prices:

Maximum Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD) - \$550,000.00

Equivalent Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP) - \$119.94 per day

Note: 7.96% is the maximum permissible interest rate as at 1 April 2026.
